Girl Scouts of Southern Alabama Honor Troop

The Honor Troop Program provides leaders with a tool to offer a quality troop program, which will aid in retention of Girl Scouts in troops. - Turn in completed Honor Troop application to either council office or email to awards@girlscoutssa.org between April 1 and June 15.
- Upon notification from council staff that your troop is an Honor Troop, patches/strips may be purchased from the council shop.
- Your troop is a Girl Scouts of Southern Alabama Honor Troop for one year.

All registered troops of Girl Scouts of Southern Alabama are eligible to participate in the program. Girls may wear the patches/strips on the back of their uniform. Leaders may wear patches/strips on patch jackets, hats, tote bags, etc. Honor Troops may purchase the Honor Troop patch/strip for each girl and adult registered in the troop. The Honor Troop program is an ongoing program that begins each membership year in October.
