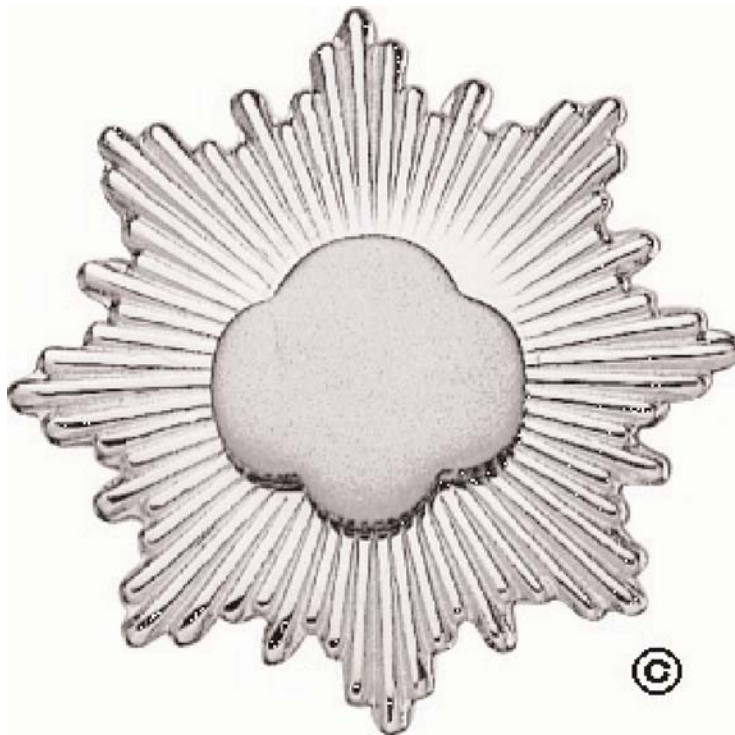

Overview of the Girl Scout Bronze Award

Congratulations! You are ready to work on the Girl Scout Bronze Award. This planner has been designed to help you with your planning process in earning the Bronze Award.

The Girl Scout Bronze Award is the highest award a Junior Girl Scout can earn. It shows you have made a promise to help others, improve your community and world, and become the best you can be. The first three requirements of the award help you build skills and will prepare you for the fourth requirement, a Girl Scout Bronze Award Project. Work closely with your Girl Scout leader or advisor in completing these requirements.

Requirements

- Complete the first three required activities before beginning your Girl Scout Bronze Award Project.
- Projects should not just be casual community service hours. The project should address a need in the community or within the Girl Scout organization that requires a plan of action.
- If you are working on a group project, you must complete 15 individual hours that contribute to the project.
- Projects cannot raise or collect funds, but can collect tangible items for donation.
- Projects should reflect YOUR interests and abilities. Make sure you choose a project that will be fun, challenging and interesting.
- Although the Council does not approve projects, a copy of your final report should be signed by your Girl Scout Bronze Award Project Advisor and sent to the Girl Scouts of Southern Alabama, Inc. Service Center closest to you by March 1 in order for you to be invited to the annual older girl recognition event held in May.
